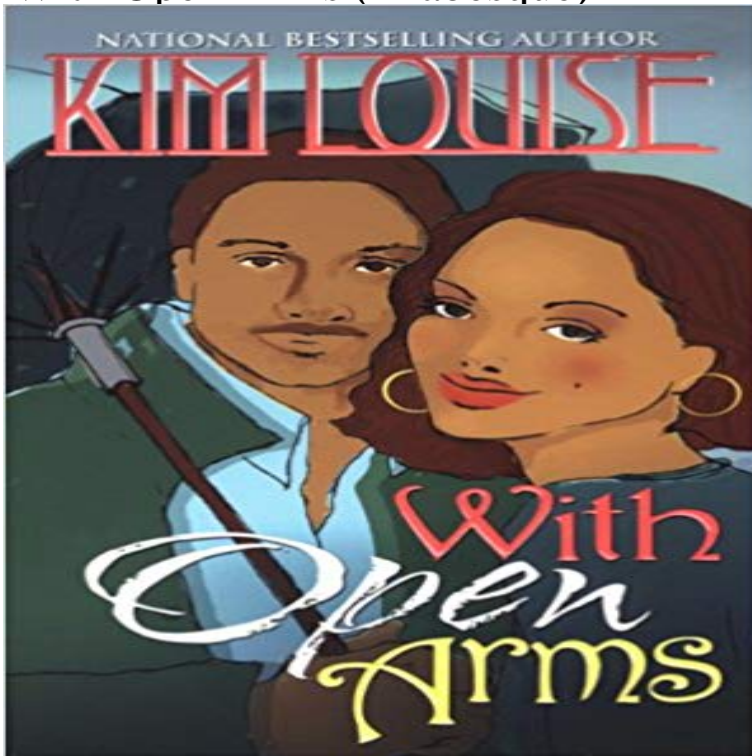


## With Open Arms (Arabesque)
