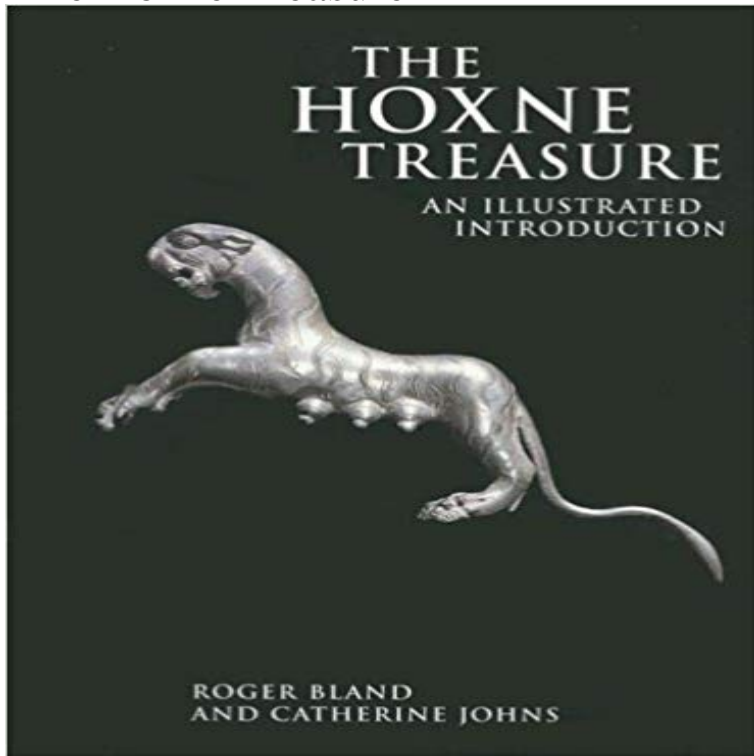


The Hoxne Treasure



The Hoxne hoard is one of the richest Roman treasures ever to have been discovered. The 14,780 coins and 200 gold and silver objects were found in a field in Suffolk in 1992 and excavated by the Suffolk Archaeological Unit.
