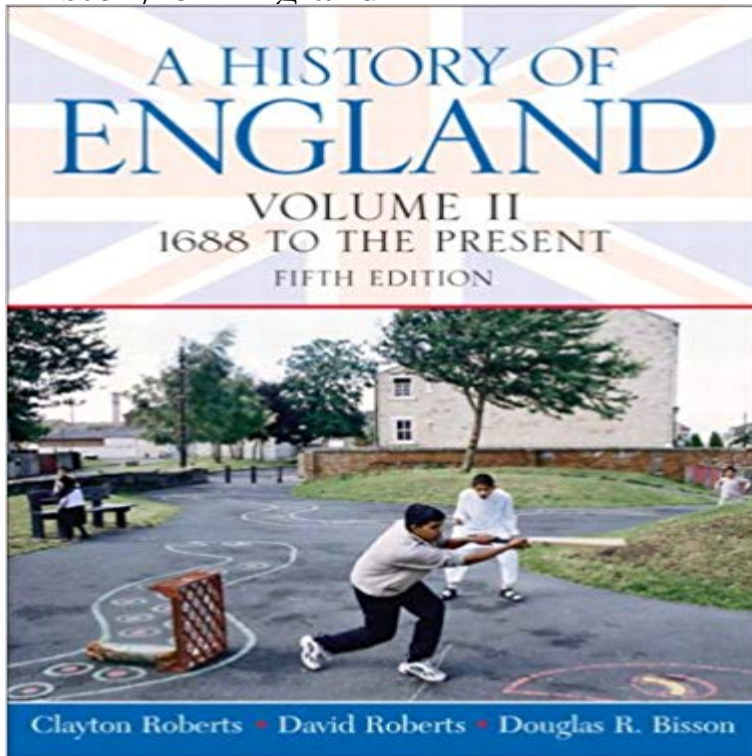


History of England
