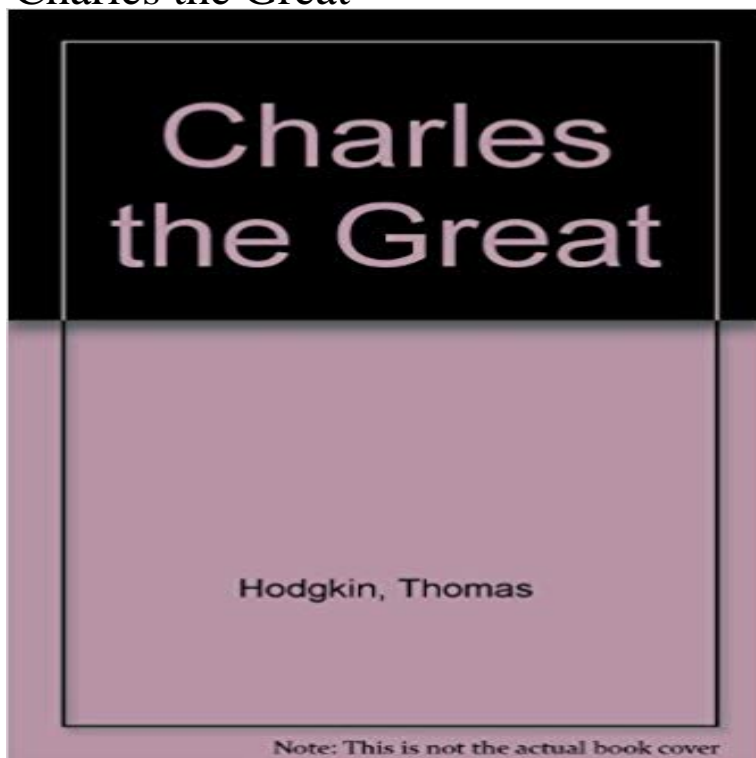


Charles the Great
