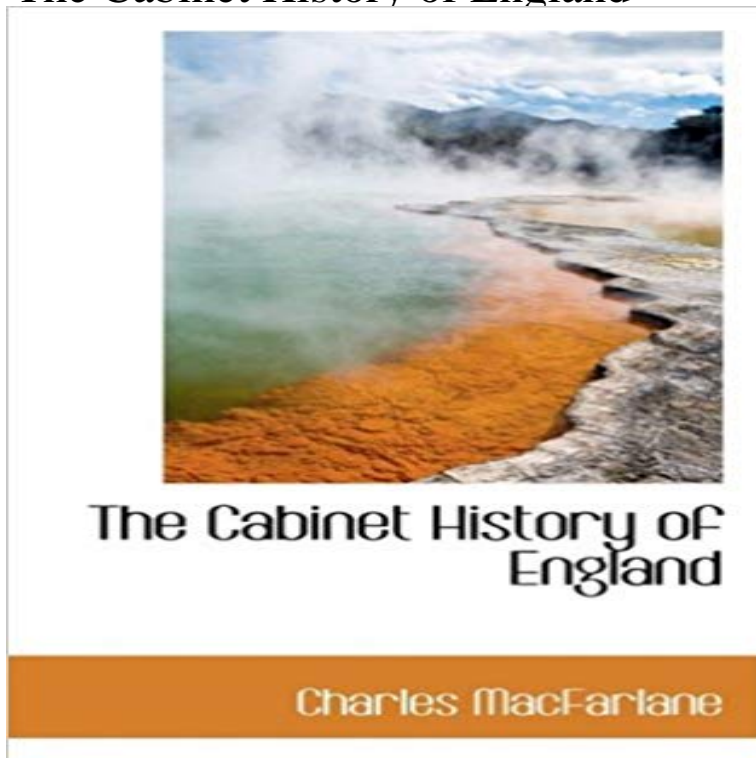


# The Cabinet History of England
