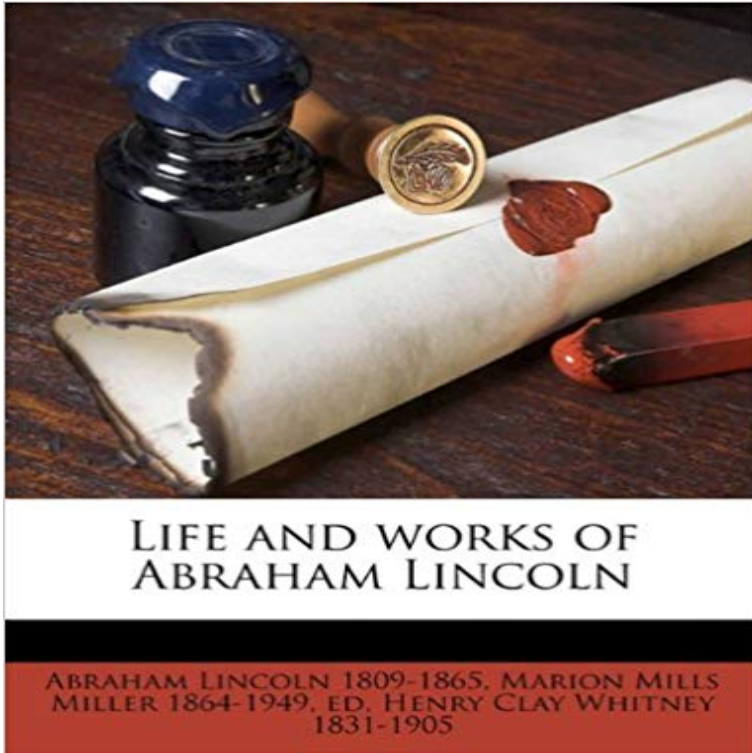


## Life and works of Abraham Lincoln Volume 6
