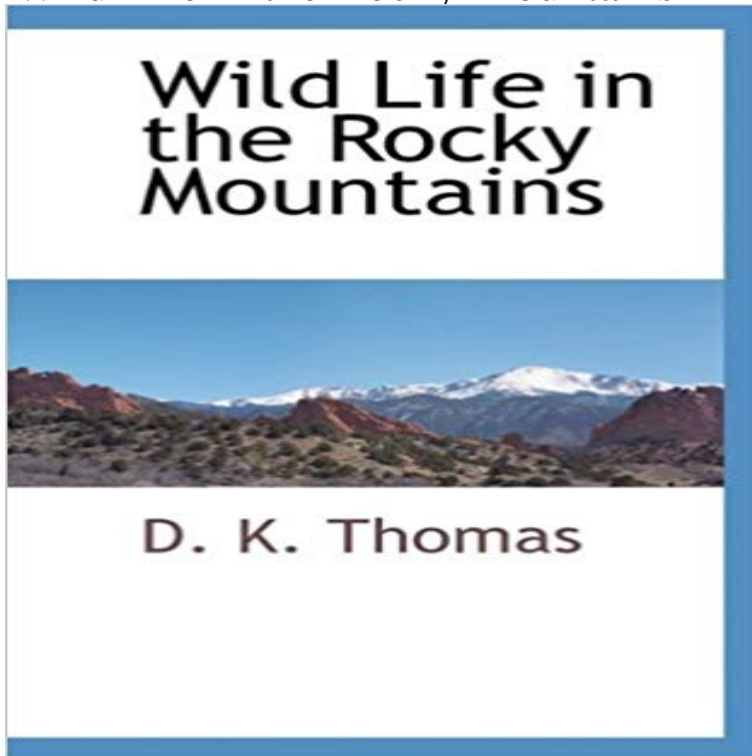


## Wild Life in the Rocky Mountains
